


# Types of Institutions

  - Bachelor Degree, Master Degree, Doctoral Degree, and Professional Degree





# Financial Aid: Federal



- Grants
  - Pell Grant
  - Academic Competitiveness Grant
  - SMART Grant
- Loans
  - Stafford Loan subsidized & unsubsidized
  - Perkins Loan
  - PLUS
- Work-Study

- Institutional Grants
- Scholarships

# Financial Aid: Community & Private

- Scholarships
  - Based on need or merit
  - Special talents
- Internships
- College Savings Plan

# Applying for Financial Aid: FAFSA

- FAFSA is required to receive federal aid and state aid
- Receive a FAFSA from:

  - Telephone: 1-800-433-3243
  - School Counselor
  - Public Library

# FAFSA: How to Apply

- Submit the FAFSA as soon as possible after January 1<sup>st</sup> (of senior year)
- Receive the Student Aid Report (SAR)
  - Confirm the information
  - Expected Family Contribution (EFC)
- 3. Receive financial aid package from institutions where you have applied
- 4. Follow up with institution
- 5. Maintain copies of all documents

# Cost of Attendance

### **State University**

= Aid Eligibility	\$12,000
- EFC	\$ 3,000
Cost of Attendance	\$15,000


### **Private University**

= Aid Eligibility	\$27,000	
- EFC	\$ 3,000	
Cost of Attendance	\$30,000

Pell Grant	\$1,000	\$1,000
State Scholarship	\$3,000	\$3,000
Institutional Grant	\$1,975	\$9,750
Loan-Stafford	\$2,625	\$2,625
Institutional Scholarships	\$1,000	\$8,000
Work-Study	\$2,000	\$2,000
Total Aid	\$11,600	\$26,375
Total Cost	\$15,000	\$30,000
-Total Aid	<u>\$11,600</u>	<u>\$26,375</u>
Net Cost (EFC + Remainder)	\$ 3,400	\$ 3,625

# What is a Scholarship?

## A Scholarship is...

- Money that does not have to be paid back.
- Based on need and/or merit.
- Based on certain criteria that students must meet.
- Aid that students may need to report to colleges.



# Researching Scholarships

- Begin EARLY!
- Do your research on the Internet, at school, and at the public library.
- Determine if you qualify.
- Create a list of scholarships organized by due dates.
- Apply to as many scholarships as possible.




# Applying for Scholarships

## Documents you might need:

- High school transcripts
- SAR from FAFSA
- Personal statements & essays
- Résumé
- Letters of recommendation
- Family income taxes

# Writing Essays

- Read the essay questions
- Write a draft
- Review/ revise
- Proofread
- Incorporate changes
- Finalize



## Letters of Recommendation

- Communication is key!
  - Distinguish yourself to teachers and counselors
- Make it easy for the recommenders
  - Share your résumé
  - Create a letter template
  - Provide sufficient time



# HSF's Top Ten Mistakes

- Forgetting to delete the other scholarships' name after cut & paste
- Submitting after deadline
- 3. Incomplete applications
- Not following instructions
- 5. Wrong copies of forms

- 6. Not submitting the FAFSA on time
- Mistakes in the essays
- Not answering questions correctly
- Late letters of recommendation
- 10. No proofreading
